Jesus took many journeys throughout Palestine with his friends. Our Christian Scriptures chronicle their journeys and tell amazing stories of how the Spirit of God moved among them and of how Jesus related with people in all walks of life. Many of our presentations this year have to do with journey: contemplative journey through the Tides of Time, journey with the mystics into the Heart of God, walking the Camino de Santiago, journey in the global community in search of Justice, living Laudato Si' through loving creation, and being attentive to the ongoing journey and evolution of Catholic Social Teaching.

Being engaged in the many aspects of journey requires that we take time, as Jesus did, to be attentive to the voice of God. Or, as he did at the home of Martha, to relax, relate and share the faith we treasure. We try to provide opportunities to "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps. 46: 10) by holding Centering Prayer gatherings every two weeks, inviting people to engage together in Holy Listening and providing time of Sabbath practice through an Oasis day of retreat on a regular basis. Another opportunity to be open to God is provided for those who wish to have a time of retreat and a prayer experience in one of our Hermitages. If you would like a guide on the journey, Spiritual Accompaniment is provided on request.

Contemplating Nature: How I Wrote The Tides of Time

September 20, 2021, 9:30a.m. – 11:30 a.m. PRESENTER: SUZANNE STEWART

This presentation will focus on Suzanne Stewart's nonfiction book, *The Tides of Time: A Nova Scotia Book of Seasons*, which traces, month by month, the seasonal harvests and labours in rural northeastern Nova Scotia and Cape Breton, an idea that she derived from a Medieval prayer book, *The Book of Hours.* Throughout the presentation, Suzanne will give a selection of readings from the book, from various months and seasons. She will also talk about the process of composing this work: her encounters with the real-life characters and rural settings, as well as the challenges (and joys) of writing itself. Additionally, Suzanne will explore relationships between the content of the book and several biblical themes: the Christian conception of Creation; the sacredness of time; and the spirituality of a journey.

Sheila O'Handley is a Diocesan hermit, trained Spiritual Director and Counsellor. Her interest and hope for the future rests in the richness of the Mystics and the Mystical Tradition of the Church.

Darlene O'Leary is Coordinator of Martha Justice Ministry. She has a PhD in Theology and Ethics from Saint Paul University in Ottawa. She has worked as the Executive Director of Galilee Centre in Arnprior, ON. Darlene has also worked with Citizens for Public Justice, an ecumenical faith-based policy organization based in Ottawa. Darlene is grateful to be back in the Maritimes, Mi'kma'ki, where she is from and where generations of her family have lived as guests on this land. She lives in Antigonish with her husband.





Sr. Joanne O'Regan is a Sister of St. Martha and is in her second term on the Leadership Team. She has a passion for Catholic Social Teaching, in particular how it informs our understanding of Integral Ecology. Expanding our awareness and examining our assumptions about both are at the heart of Gospel Hospitality. Hopefully, this lens through which to see and experience the world – to see our lives – will aid us in understanding the Gospel message and new ways to experience our faith.

Ernst Schuegraf taught computer science at StFX University in his spare time, as he told colleagues at a meeting once. He also had many hobbies, from raising sheep, chickens, ducks, pigs, geese, bees, a big garden and a fruit orchard, to fishing, stained glass, cooking and eating fine food – he has even written a cookbook called Cooking with the Saints.



Karen Schuegraf has been a homemaker and stay-at-home mum of four children and is an active member of St. Ninian's. She has enjoyed working with dogs and horses and been involved with Christian Unity. She now spends time with her grandchildren and parents, as well as walking, praying and listening to music.



Sr. Marion Sheridan is a Sister of St. Martha. She holds a Master's degree in social work. She has worked in that field for many years and in various places. She has also completed a three-year internship in psychoanalytic therapy. She has served on many Boards and was part of founding initiatives to strengthen the communities in which she lived. She has been the Martha NGO Liaison with the Federation of the Sisters of Charity since 2009.

Sr. Marion works from the basis that each of us is a unique human being and a global citizen. She weaves through all this the Martha charism of Gospel Hospitality.

Suzanne Stewart embraces life with a deep attachment to literature. *The Tides of Time* published in 2018, was a culmination of her thinking about rural life (studied for years in poetry and fiction) and of her own observations (recorded daily) of the natural beauty in Nova Scotia. In this book, she sought to portray the timelessness (not the disappearance) of the dignity, value, and ingenuity of rural existence, which uniquely encompasses, in this region, both land and water. Also deeply spiritual, Suzanne wished to



weave into the book a Christian understanding of time, in which day-to-day experiences of chronological events are pierced with moments of transcendence. When not writing, Suzanne reads voraciously and teaches part-time in the English Department at StFX University. She also spends long periods out-of-doors: walking, cycling, running, and observing all forms of wildlife (especially, at very early hours in the morning).

Bethany Grounds provide spaces where individuals can touch into the wonder and beauty of creation realizing the love and care of the Creator.




St. Theresa's Garden

Bethany Arboretum

Bethany property is the home to many beautiful trees. We have chosen 25 trees as Phase I to help you identify and get to know them better. Each tree commemorates persons or events in the history of the Sisters of St. Martha, honouring the deep connection of our shared journey. The Arboretum is an ongoing project which is growing into the future.



Hermitages

Solitude and silence allow for a new hearing and healing from the stillness and deep connections to God through the beauty and wonder of the Universe.

Our Hermitages are modern, fully furnished and conducive to contemplation. Inside you'll find cookware, basic food items (tea, coffee), towels and bed linens, refrigerator, stove, microwave, kettle, toaster, and coffee maker. Groceries are not provided but are available at local stores.
