Over the past year our emphasis has been on Justice Issues.

We viewed the DVD "The Narrow Path" This was a presentation by John Dear sj on the non-violent Jesus. This told of John Dear, a Jesuit Priest's journey who was called to follow Jesus and to fight injustice using non-violent protesters and actions to bring about change, He was arrested and jailed numerous times.

We had guest speakers-2 gay men, one in recovery from aids. They prefaced their talks with scripture passages; the Beatitudes and St. Paul to the Romans. They spoke on what it means to be gay, the abuse and their personal self-esteem and how they cope.

They commented on how surprised they were to be invited by a Catholic Sister to speak to a Catholic group considering the position of the Catholic Church. But they were pleased to come and a little afraid as to how they would be received.

The group responded with much interest, questions and discussion and I might say much love. They felt very relaxed and welcomed by all, They joined us for our social time.



We continued our justice theme by having Sister Jovita MacPherson come to share with the group her work with the "street People" in Halifax. Her sharing was most interesting and informative.

We are always curious and interested to hear from the Sisters about their lives and missions. It increases our bond with all the Marthas. It deepens our awareness of the blessing it is for us to be so closely connected and part of such a Martha Community of compassionate and caring women.

My name is Annie Catherine Denny and I am an Associate of the Sisters of St Martha in Eskasoni, NS. I would like to begin by telling you a story of the Cross on our mountain in Eskasoni, as it was told by an elder from our community.

A young girl by the name of Annie Isabelle Denny saw a vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus while getting water from a well not far from her home. Her mother did not seem to believe her until the mother looked in her prayer book and the child was able to point to the picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The story spread through the village and her story was recited to the priest in the community. She was questioned at great length by a number of priests. Finally everyone was satisfied with Annie's answers. The priest blessed Annie and her mother was told that her daughter would be an instrument for many cures.

A fire in a form of the Holy Cross was seen on the mountain by Annie. On September 14, 1922 on the Feast day of the Holy Cross the people from the community erected a cross on the mountain. From then on people came from surrounding native communities on Good Friday for prayer services and to pray the Stations of the Cross.

This year was no different on Good Friday, hundreds of people went up to our cross on the



mountain to pray and say the Stations of the Cross. People young and old from the surrounding areas and as far as Truro started the annual event Thursday night at 12 o'clock.

We were blessed with a beautiful sunny day which made our pilgrimage to the cross a beautiful experience. When I was a young girl my mom use to tell me stories of the many cures and miracles that were witnessed on the mountain.

Finally I would like to conclude by inviting you to come to Eskasoni next year on Good Friday and witness for yourself the peaceful feeling you experience by going up to the mountain top.
